COMMITTEE NEWS

An update on the progress of our Grant Application to construct a Community Meeting/Food & Beverage/Clubhouse facility at the golf course:

We have been hard at work having weekly meetings, liaising with architects, town planning consultants and council to be able to submit an application by mid to late April. We have passed the first hurdle which was to convince a Sub-committee of the Bushfire Recovery Commission of the merits of our project, we are now able to proceed with our application for the grant.

We have titled the project as 'Warrawurrudthang' which is Jaitmathang (Yitma-thang) for Meeting Place in order to recognise the indigenous ties of this end of the Kiewa Valley. The Jaitmathang and Dhudhuroa (Dod-dor-oa) tribes met here to access the Bogong Moths on the Bogong High Plains.

The committee would like to thank all who have contributed to the process and are cautiously optimistic of a positive outcome.

This month we welcome 2 new members, Bruce Plant as a Country Member and local painter Laif Moegel as a Full Member. We hope you will enjoy your membership and the course.

UPCOMING EVENTS

This coming Saturday, 3 April is the Men's Monthly Medal day as usual, combined with the 3rd round of the Club Championships.

The first 3 Saturdays in April will be set aside for the final 3 rounds of the Club Championships. The Club Championships will be played over 5 rounds with the best 3 of your rounds counting for the final score. 2 rounds have been played in March, see later for an update of those rounds.

Slotted in on the Monday, 5 April, will be a Stableford round for the Easter Monday holiday.









Following the intense 5 weeks of the Club Championships we will play a fun event as chosen by our President – with a bit of a twist this year as President Andrew McEnnally has made a seachange and is no longer in Mount Beauty. The task of choosing a suitable format to play on Saturday 24 April will fall to Vice President Peter Johns. We will await Pete's choice.

The next day, Sunday 25 April, is a very important day on the Australian calendar as it is ANZAC Day. We will play a Stableford round on that day.

Monthly Medal will again be played on Saturday 1 May.

The following Saturday, 8 May, you will need to grab 3 others to play a 4 Ball Ambrose event.

A very important Memorial Day is scheduled for Saturday 22 May in honour of Stephen Green. Stephen was instrumental in changing our course from sand scrapes to greens in 2001. This will be a Stableford event

On Wednesday 26 May there will be a Front 9 4BBB Vegas stableford comp. This involves teams of 4 players in which Teams of two players are chosen and a team score is calculated on each hole by putting the lowest stableford score first e.g. player 1 scores 3 points for the hole and player 2 scores 2 points – the team score is 23. The golfers' scores for each hole are paired up for a combined score.

Saturday 29 May will be another 4BBB event.


