# Course News

Hopefully there is only a week or so left for the temporary greens. The 'real' greens are coming along OK at this stage with the watering system set to come on quite regularly, for short durations, during the day - so don't be surprised if you get wet while putting. We would ask that you DO NOT interfere with any watering

equipment or taps as this watering cycle is vital to the success of the maintenance works carried out.

#### Wildlife on the Course

Please be aware that all wildlife on the course can be dangerous if approached.

With the increasing numbers of kangaroos on the course if your ball happens to go near them it is safer to take relief and drop another ball, no closer to the hole, rather than try to retrieve your ball from within the mob.

# **Upcoming Events**

The Ladies' competitions have a start time of 9am for 9.30am. This timing will continue until further notice, usually when the weather starts to cool down.

The Ladies' Monthly Medal day is the first Wednesday of the month, being 2 March and 6 April.

#### Member's Travels






Cape Wickham GC


