
Weeding and Repairing Our Greens

Now that the greens are well on their way to recovery the Committee would like to ask everyone to weed out one or two flat weeds on the greens while you have your round of golf. This can be done while you wait for your putt or wait for others to putt. It does not take long and will be a huge help to the recovering grass as it will not have to compete with weeds.

I have found the quickest way to pull the weed up is to use your Pitch Mark Repairer and push it under the weed and 'flick' the weed out.

Once the weed has been removed the best way to repair the hole which is left is to insert the repair tool at the edge of the pitch mark. Do NOT insert the tool within the depression itself. Push the tool **forward** from the edge of the pitch mark toward the centre, as pictured.

Do this around the edges of the indentation.

Do NOT insert the tool under the indented area and try to pry up the depressed turf - a common mistake and this only damages the root system. Think of it as pushing turf in from the edges toward the centre. Tamp down the repaired area with your putter so that the surface is even.

You should not only pull up weeds you should also repair your pitch marks and, time permitting, you should repair

any other pitch marks you see. The method is the same.


