Captain's Message

"Thanks to some decent weather and some hard work in trying conditions the full 18 hole course is now mowed and playable. We are confident that given no rain between now and Saturday we will be in a position to allow the use of carts for competition play only. There will be some conditions on where the carts will be able to travel through some still wet areas, but we will let cart users know where these areas are.

Given that carts are permitted come the weekend, the Club Championships will commence this Saturday and continue until completed over the next three consecutive Saturdays. Remember this year the championships are four rounds with the best three scores to count.

Due to the dreadful weather throughout winter and so far this spring the club has seen a significant drop in both green fee and competition revenue (who could blame people not wanting to play in the conditions) it would be great to see strong fields turn out to the upcoming events. The Club Championships are for A, B, & C grades so let's all get up there starting at normal times from this Saturday!
