UPCOMING EVENTS

As always there will be a Stableford round on Tuesday 3 November – Melbourne Cup Day. This is for Mixed, Men and Ladies groups.

Then on Saturday 7 November the last Monthly Medal of the season will be played, with the CAZNA Cup to be contested between the season's Medal winners on Saturday 5 December.

Saturday 14 November is a 4 Ball Ambrose event. This will be a Men's, Ladies and Mixed event. A Sunday Stableford is scheduled for the following day, the 15th.

The Foursomes Championships will be played on Saturday 21 November. In Foursomes golfers compete in teams of two, using only one ball per team, and taking alternate shots until the hole is completed. Golfers take turns teeing off on each hole and thereafter play alternate shots.

The December Monthly Medal will be played on Saturday 5 December. This is the first medal for the 2021 season. On the same day the winners of the Medals for 2020 will shoot it out for the right to have their name on the CAZNA Cup.

NEW GREENS WATERING CONTROLLERS

We recently received a \$2400 grant from the Alpine Shire Council to replace the older automated sprinkler controllers with newer technology sprinkler controllers. Roger Church has given the newsletter his report about the replacement.

"Automated watering of our grass greens is managed by battery operated irrigation controllers. However, the controllers we installed 6-8 years ago are older technology that are not able to automate the required watering cycle for the hottest summer days.

As the weather warms up in summer, all greens are watered every night. However, on hot days of 35 degrees or more a very short watering cycle of 1-3 minutes in the heat of the afternoon is required to cool down the grass and help keep the greens alive. On the hottest days, two short cycles are required.

Our current controllers only allow for 4 fixed units of time per day. If we program in 3 x 10 minutes of watering at night we are therefore limited to a 10 minute cycle in the afternoon. This is not an acceptable use of water for the golf club. This means that in really hot weather we have to send volunteers out onto the course in the heat of the day to manually operate the sprinklers for 1 or 2 minutes. Every green on every really hot day, and sometimes twice a day if there is a heatwave. Needless to say there has been a plethora of very hot days in recent summers.

The older technology also means that any changes to the watering program require volunteers to stop at each location and physically access the controller, a time-consuming process.

We wanted to upgrade our controllers to allow us to both automate whatever watering program we choose and to make changes to this program more easily via a Bluetooth connection. This will reduce volunteer time and effort overall, but most especially during the hottest parts of the hottest days of the year.

If we replace our controllers, the old ones will not be wasted. We currently do not have automatic watering of our tee blocks. We plan to reuse the old controllers on our tees where this simpler technology will be very effective."




