The second bore pump between the 2nd & 16th fairways had been giving us some grief over the last year or so. This was recently replaced & am happy to report that it is still running well to date. The extra bore takes the pressure off for keeping the tank filled during the hotter months.

The position of the 17th Red Tee has been moved forward around 35 metres or so at the request of the ladies & is proving to be in a much friendlier spot.

The course is in great condition at the moment, thanks to a cooler & wetter January & February allowing the grass to stay green, especially on the fairways. Stephen Short and the team of volunteers certainly do a great job with the course maintenance and are to be congratulated in providing such a great product for us to enjoy.

Recently the cockies have worked out how they can remove the PVC rings from the top of the holes. Fortunately the damage had been relatively minor. 'Eagles' have been strung up on some of the greens and seem to be a good deterrent to these pests.
