COURSE NEWS

There will be a Working Bee on Sundays 6 & 20 March starting around 8/8.30am with the main aim to tidy up the areas on the course affected by the recent tree and stump removal. It is planned to rake up the majority of the exposed rocks at the stump removal sites and build small, strategic, mounds as an extra hazard at some of the sites. Bring along a shovel, a rake & a trailer (if you have one).



The new location for the White Tee on the 18th has proved popular, with the green slightly more accessible to the shorter hitters. The removal of the trees in the area has enhanced the 'gallery experience' from the deck as the action on the 17th green can be viewed.


"You must be an engineer," said the balloonist.
