FOODWORKS

COURSE NEWS

With the recent rains over the last weeks the course is getting a bit damp. Caution should be taken when driving carts over the course as conditions can be slippery. Alternative routes will need to be taken on a few of the fairways to avoid damage to the course &/or getting bogged.

NO CARTS are to be bought closer than 10 metres to ANY green.

The Committee and the volunteers thank you for your consideration.



If you are walking your pets on the golf course we ask that you keep them under control, either by putting them on a lead or having good voice control over them, & please DO NOT allow them to chase our resident kangaroos. Not only could this cause harm to the roos but your pet could be hurt by them or follow them onto the surrounding roads where the roos &/or your pets could be hit by vehicles. We allow, & encourage, the use of our course for walking pets however if the instances of chasing increases the Committee will be forced to reconsider our policy.

Those of you who play the course will have noticed the Whiteboard under the shelter where you pay your green fees & may be wondering what the info on it means.

Our resident 'Stimpologist' measures the speed of the greens after he has mowed them. A stimpmeter is the weird-looking triangular implement sitting on the shelf on the back wall. The green block of wood is placed on the green & the ball is placed on the hollowed out length of wood on the meter & allowed to roll off the end. The speed of the green is measured from the end of the meter to where the ball come to rest & is measured in feet (which happens to be the length of the green block). 6 – 9 feet is considered an average speed. FYI: the speed of most greens played in professional tournaments is usually between 12 & 14 'on the stimpmeter'.

A big 'Shout Out' to all the volunteers who are working steadily on keeping the course in such great condition.

JUST A THOUGHT

With sand bins on all tees, how about filling divots as you walk down the fairway? You will be able to fill your bucket on the next tee and you never know, maybe next time you play, your ball may end up in the divot you filled.

I once read in a golf magazine that if every player repaired three pitch marks on every green they played, then we would have no pitch marks on greens. So the next time you are waiting for your group to putt out, how about looking around you to see if there are pitch marks you can repair. Both of these suggestions will help keep our course in the best possible shape and make your round more enjoyable.

CLUB SHIRTS






