COURSE NEWS

The course is starting to dry out nicely over the last few weeks with little rainfall having been recorded & plenty of sunshine. Caution should still be taken when driving carts over the course as conditions can be slippery. Alternative routes will need to be taken on a few of the fairways to avoid damage to the course &/or getting bogged.

NO CARTS are to be driven closer than 10 metres to ANY green.

The Committee and the volunteers thank you for your consideration.

We were successful with our Alpine Shire Community Grant application and have purchased three battery powered garden tools:

Mount Beauty Golf Club was pleased that its priorities matched those of the Alpine Shire Council in pursuing an increase in physical activity, reducing the impact of climate change, and improving mental wellbeing, and thanks the Council for supporting a Community Grant application for grounds management and safety equipment. The purchase of quiet battery powered trimmer, pole-saw and blower will improve safety for visitors and players, and its ease of use will encourage club volunteers to continue connecting in a 'men's shed' environment and carry out grounds' maintenance upon the property. The Alpine Shire Council is to be thanked for its encouragement in all stages of the application process, and ultimately its approval of our grant request.

STAN CHURCH TO SPONSOR 'BIRTHDAY' COMP







Stan at 97.95 years

The 9th of the 9th this year is a Saturday. **It also happens to be Stan Church's 98th birthday.** The program will be a 3 Ball Ambrose.

Stan will donate the prizes for the winners and for some golf balls. He will also grace the deck at the clubhouse after golf for the presentations.

Stan joined the golf club in the early 1980's, just before retiring. Once he retired in 1985 it was not long before he was a volunteer and committee member. A regular mower of the fairways with the gangs, a regular mower of the rough with the slasher, the main waterer of the grass greens when they were first established, fill in mower of the greens, and general volunteer. Probably best known as the bar manager for about 20 years. He held most positions on the committee, including President, Secretary, and Treasurer. He also played golf...

In December of 2013 the newsletter asked Stan a series of questions – here were his answers:

Stan Church

NAME: Stanley William Church

YEARS A MEMBER: 33 YEARS PLAYING GOLF: 33

OCCUPATION: Commonwealth Public Servant, PMG Dept, later Telecom and Australia Post - 1940 to 1986. Started as a Telegraph Messenger in Wodonga. Became a Telegraphist in 1944 at Chief telegraph Office in Melbourne. Later went into the Postal side and worked at various places in the North East (Vic). With my interest in skiing, when the job of Postmaster Mt Beauty came up, I applied for the job and was appointed in 1955. However the powers that be needed someone to fill the job at the Commonwealth Immigration Centre at Bonegilla, so I stayed there until January 1960, when I finally got to Mt Beauty.

In October 1960 I got a job as Radio Officer at Wilkes Base in Antarctica from 10 January 1960 till the end of March 1962. Whilst there I was the radio bloke on a 300 mile traverse which lasted for 3 months, collecting seismic and other scientific information.


