Winner on the Day Don Mason

On the day the Stroke winner was Don Mason with net 67 followed by Macca Deans with a net 69. Balls in the Ball Comp were awarded to Ron Gallagher 72, Wes Dowel, Allan Ferrari, James Martin & Emil Solar, all with a net 73. NTP's: 7th Peter Hertzog 9th Andrew McEnnally 17th & 18th Allan Ferrari. Nearest 3rd shot on the Par 5 14th was Ben Charlton.

Saturday 24 November was Captain Ben's go at choosing us a very interesting format for the Comp of the Day – he chose a Las Vegas Stableford style of game.

Teams of two players are chosen and a team score is calculated on each hole. The golfers' scores for each hole are paired up for a combined score. For example, if player A gets a 4 and player B gets a

6, the team score is 46 (the lower number goes first). If both players get a 5, then the team score is 55; if one shoots a 7 and the other a 3, then the team score is 37.

Points are accumulated during the round with the team with the lowest

score being the winner.

The winners were Don Mason & Allan Retallick with 333 points. Runners Up were Roger Church & Macca Deans with 310 points. Balls in the Ball Comp were won by Emil Solar & Trevor English with 307 points. The Individual winner was Ron Gallagher with 43 points followed by Roger Church with 38 points. tells the story:

"Mount Beauty Golf Club President, Andrew McEnnally said that "many Power Industry Association veterans told him stories about the 1988 Mount Beauty PIA event where school kids caddied for them on Friday afternoon and they ate dinner sitting on hay bales under a tent pitched up on the lawn outside our tiny clubhouse."

Whilst the clubhouse is still tiny, the drinks were at 1988 prices and the golf club hosted a welcome dinner in the local community hall thanks to the generous support of major sponsors AGL, Tyree Transformers, TexOnsite & Electrix.



The Mount Beauty Club had a hard act to follow, but thanks to a dedicated band of volunteers they turned on their country hospitality to welcome the 100 golfers playing their breathtaking Kiewa Valley course.

The transformation of this course from sand-scrapes in 1988 to beautiful lush grass greens is testament to the hard work of many dedicated volunteers. The beautiful weather and condition of the course was also reflected in the good scores posted across the weekend. The 2018 event was well supported by AGL Energy, Tyree Transformers, Electrix, TexOnsite and Drummond Golf. Special thanks to AGL's Stuart Cariss and Tyree Transformers' Scott Steele who helped present trophies on Friday and Sunday evening.

The State 4BBB pairs event was won by the final group pairing of PIA stalwart John Dallimore and





PIA debutant Tom Crosbie of Powercor Shepparton. Tom carried John to his first perpetual trophy win as they carded an impressive 49 points to win by two from the evergreen pairing of Reuben Kincaid and Garry Sullivan.

Powercor's Eddie Murdoch won the State 36 Hole Stableford and Over 50's event with 76 points (35pts Sat & 41 pts Sun).

To defend the state title they won in 1988, AGL Mount Beauty assembled a four person local team led by AGL employee Stuart Jelbart and three retired Mount Beauty based SECV employees, Peter Hertzog, Stephen Short and Taff Sullivan. Around their home track, this team finished fourth out of the 18 teams, only six points behind the AGL Loy Yang team. AGL Loy Yang took out the McColl Shield for the second year in a row with a team score of 109 points accumulated by Charles Weir 39, David Trengrove 35, Stewart Cluning 35 & Reuben Kincaid 30.

The 2018 State Scratch Championship was won by AGL Loy Yang's Stewart Cluning with scratch scores of 78 and 76 = 154 (10 over par) after a tight Sunday contest with fellow AGL employee and 2012 PIA State Champion Reuben Kincaid. This is Stewart's sixth win in row at the State Championships.

In recognition of the contribution and recent passing of Ivan Harris and Ken Flannigan, the PIA have initiated a "Spirit of the PIA Award" named in their honour to be awarded annually at the conclusion of the State Championships. The inaugural recipient of this award is Sue Pearson, who despite surgery to both feet only five weeks ago attended the event to enjoy the camaraderie of friends and recently retired workmates.
