Course News

There was a Working Bee at the course on Sunday 7 May and the turnout was very pleasing. Many tasks were completed and Thanks to the people who joined in on the day.



Some of you may have noticed the red 'balls' placed on the flag sticks of most of the holes. These are hole position indicators, if the ball is at the top of the flag the hole is in the back third of the green and if at the bottom of the flag the hole is in the front third of the green. Obviously, the ball halfway up the flag the hole is in the middle third. This should make it easier to judge where the hole is on the green.

The next stage of the Bore Project is ready to be put into action with the help of Taf Sullivan, cutting a trench in front of the 2nd green, and Quicky laying the power cable for the pumps. AGL will be connecting the power to the shed near the tank shortly.

A huge 'Thankyou' to Middys of Wodonga who very kindly donated the cables required to get the power from the corner of Fairway Ave to the shed. Their generosity has saved us at least \$2000.



Preferred lies have been taken off the course and it is looking pretty good at the moment thanks to ALL the guys and girls who spend countless hours on the course keeping it in great condition.

Wildlife on the Course

Please be aware that all wildlife on the course can be dangerous if approached. With the increasing numbers of kangaroos on the course if your ball happens to go near them it is safer to take relief and drop another ball, no closer to the hole, no penalty, rather than try to retrieve your ball from within the mob.

Local Rule Adopted

A Local Rule for Accidental Movement of a Ball on a Putting Green has been adopted by the Match Committee and comes into effect immediately. A detailed description follows:

Rule 18-2 provides for a onestroke penalty if a player causes his ball in play to move, unless certain exceptions apply. Decision 18-2/0.5 explains that when it is uncertain what caused a ball to move, all relevant information must be considered and the weight of the evidence must be evaluated. If it is more likely than not that the player caused the ball to move, the player incurs a one-stroke penalty under Rule 18-2 and the ball must be replaced. Otherwise, the player incurs no penalty and the ball must be played as it lies unless

some other Rule applies (e.g. Rule 18-1).

"Accidental Movement of a Ball on a Putting Green"

Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1 are modified as follows:

When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ballmarker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment. The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1.

This Local Rule applies only when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental.

Note: If it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.
