Upcoming Events

The Ladies' Monthly Medal day is the first Saturday of the month, being 4 March and 1 April.

This date now corresponds to the Men's Monthly Medal dates as the Ladies' have changed their 'major' day to a Saturday to enable the growing number of working ladies starting their golfing careers to play. The committee has welcomed this change and hope it will attract more ladies to the game at a time which is more convenient for them to play. The time change may also facilitate social interaction between the men and the ladies as their tee off times, therefore finishing times, are similar.

Always good for entertainment value.

Saturdays 25 March and 1 April will see the men playing both rounds of the Kiewa Hydro Cup. The second round coinciding with the April Men's Monthly Medal.

April is a huge month for honour board and major comp days with Saturday 8th seeing a replacement event for the past Lion's Day event. This year the format will again be a 4 Ball Ambrose, only the name has changed. There will still be the usual BBQ and earlier tee off time. Details next newsletter.

Easter will be full on with an event scheduled every day. Good Friday will be a Stableford game followed on Saturday by a 'Bisque' format, Sunday is Par with Monday playing a 2 Ball Ambrose.

For those of you not familiar with 'Bisque' – vaguely, the format enables flexibility with your handicap 'strokes' to enable the player to use his / her strokes as they see fit.

E.g. if you have a handicap of, say, 18, instead of getting a stroke on every hole you are

able to use as many strokes on a particular hole you think you may need in order to have a reasonable score. BUT, beware, you can only use your 18 strokes over the round! Use them wisely. Allocation of the strokes will, in this instance. be able to be done AFTER the hole has been played. This will be very interesting and careful note will need to be taken of the number of strokes from a player's handicap taken over the round.

Saturday 22 April will be Captain's Choice on the day.

The Mixed and Men's Canadian will once again be played on ANZAC Day, Tuesday 25 April, with all proceeds, plus a donation from the club, going to Legacy.

The following Saturday will be the Final of the Round Robin Men's Matchplay Championship which started on 18 March.

March and April will be a fun couple of months with a lot of golf on offer including the normal rounds usually played on a Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday.



Rules Modernisation

Overnight (1 March) the R&A and the United States Golf Association made a major announcement on **proposed** changes to modernise the Rules of Golf. The announcement includes an explanation of each of the 30 major proposed changes.

Details of the announcement are available from the following page of the Golf Australia website – www.golf.org.au/modernisation

Among the more than 30 substantial changes are that:

- Penalties for accidentally moving your ball while searching for it or accidentally moving your ball or ball marker on the green will be scrapped;
- Time allowed for ball searches will be reduced from five to three minutes;
- A ball being dropped can now be released at any height above the ground without touching anything;
- There is no longer a penalty for hitting an unattended flagstick with a putt from on the green;
- Touching or removal of loose impediments in a bunker is now permissible; and
- Almost all damage, including spike marks and animal

damage, can be repaired on the green.

Golf Australia are hoping for and expecting great feedback on these and all the changes to the Rules of Golf from Australian players.
