COMMITTEE NEWS

The committee moved a motion recently to move from awarding cash prizes for competitions to a voucher system. (This will help those who were winning so much cash their amateur status was in jeopardy). Thanks to support from local businesses this process has begun and the vouchers are now being given out each competition day and have also been backdated to the start of this season. Amounts of vouchers and golf balls directly relates to the numbers in our competition on the day, with both the voucher amount and ball comp increasing from what it has been.



The important thing about the voucher system is that the day's sponsor will be announced at presentations and advertised in the newsletter, Border Mail and on the Local Radio, as being the Sponsor of the day.

The number of balls given out in the Ball Comp was also adjusted so that balls will be given to all place-getters having the same score as the last eligible player in the placings, i.e. if there is supposed to be 4 balls in the ball comp and the 4th person has, say, 36 points, all others on 36 will also get a ball. There will be no countbacks required for the Ball Comp.

The invoices for Membership Fees for the upcoming 2018/19 year, which will be **due by June 30 2018**, have been sent out.

COURSE NEWS

Alan, Murray and Michael have been busy planting ornamental trees around the course to slowly replace any trees that will die over the next few years in order to keep the integrity of the course layout pretty much the same as it is now.

On the left side of most fairways, at the 100m mark, we have planted a Maple Tree. This will help those without GPS's to navigate the distances to the centre of the green. This is still a work in progress with only a few holes to be done in the spring. We are waiting for the small seedlings we have to get a little larger before planting out so they can fend for themselves. If anyone has largish Maples they do not want please let either Alan Retallick or Michael Bartholomew know. Alternatively, potted trees of 2 to 3 feet tall can be left near the Men's 10th Tee and we will find a spot for them. Thanks in advance.

Also, if anyone has unwanted ornamental or hedge type trees they wish to donate these would be appreciated.

Recently some irrigation pipework has been replaced and a few areas of fairway have been 'regrassed' with 'surplus to requirements' turf kindly donated by Len Tonn from his new home. These areas are to be treated as GUR until they become established. Please do not walk on the new areas and a drop can be taken without penalty if there is interference to your stance or if your ball is on the GUR area.









WILDLIFE ON THE COURSE



They may look cute but please be aware that all wildlife on the course can be dangerous if approached.

With the increasing numbers of kangaroos on the course, if your ball happens to go near them, it would be safer to take relief and drop another ball no closer to the hole, rather than try to retrieve your ball from within their mob.

The R&A and the United States Golf Association have announced the finalised changes to the Rules of Golf. The new Rules will come into effect on 1 January 2019.
