The course is in great condition at the moment & is starting to dry out. The Match Committee has put **Preferred Lies** 'Thru the Green' at the moment. Mark, clean & place the ball within a card (hand span) length of your marker.

The 'Fairway of the Week' sign has been circulating for a few weeks now & most players seem to be repairing divots and pitch marks. Keep up the good work on any fairway, tee & green.

The trenching that has been done on the 12th, 13th & 14th is to be treated as GUR. Full Relief within 1 club length.

The grass is starting to grow again, please be mindful of any machinery on the course & give way to them please.

The Committee would like to remind all Cart Users that **NO CARTS are to be driven closer than 10 metres to ANY green**. Please be mindful of any wetter areas on the course & try to avoid driving through them.

Richard Wilson managed to snag his first hole in one on the 7th. Her kindly did a little write up about that for this newsletter:



On my last day of freedom before heading back to work, I was able to sneak out under the managers blessing and have a round with Dave, one of the usual golfing buddies (fella that got smacked in the noggin from a rouge fairway shot last year).

In recent weeks, I've been away and couldn't have a hit with Dave. In that time, a family member of his has sadly passed away, so he arrived with some homemade whiskey and glasses to have a drink to commemorate the loss.

"I'll have some when we're done." I say, weary of having any after remembering the worst hangover I've ever had after having a few of his brews two years earlier.

For the most part, the front 9 wasn't flashy. Multiple doubles sprinkled with some pars and bogies. The whole way round, I had been rejecting the generous offers of whisky until the end of the round. We get to the seventh hole. For those that have played there, it's a 180 meter par 3. Small green, usually a little tricky

to hit due to three monster pine trees on the left. However, to my delight, the club had cut all those trees down, making it much easier to go for the green.

I take the trusty 5 iron out. It usually is enough to land just before the green, and with any luck, would hopefully roll on. I line up, hoping to easily move the ball left to right now the pines were no longer standing. The ball doesn't move left to right, but went straight as an arrow, a thing of natural beauty. The plan worked for the most part, landing just before the green before rolling down into the swale. From the tee, I couldn't see the ball until it rolled out of the swale onto the green. A moment of despair thinking it might have plugged, but then I see it rolling slowly onto the green, hunting the pin, and then I lose it. The sun was making it hard to see at that time of day. Dave and I look at each other.

"Blimey, that looked like it was going straight at it and went...." I don't finish my sentence, instead opting to run with a more likely scenario.

"Nah, probably rolled off the back." Dave agrees. In my head, I was convinced it went it.

We go deal with Dave's mongrel shot, the whole time assessing the green as we get closer. The ball is nowhere to be seen. Dave lands on for 4, calling the ball a number of special names in the process. We checked behind the green and no ball can be found. It's now the levels of belief start to rise in Dave's face. Naturally, we erupted. Without question, Dave pours two shots of whisky. I had no choice in the

I managed a 43 on the front with that effort and finished with a 40 on the back, the whole time on a high, and I'm pretty sure I had the biggest Smile on the course.

A great way to finish holidays. Looking forward to shooting 110 next weekend.
